



MI'KMAQ NATION JOB DESCRIPTION

TITLE: SAMHSA Project - Cultural Knowledge Keeper

SUPERVISOR: Tribal Historic Preservation Director

GENERAL FUNCTION: Raise the level of Tribal unity and community interaction while increasing cultural awareness of Tribal people, programs, functions and SAMHSA project activities. This position will engage tribal programs to include culture and basic language skills in programming.

QUALIFICATIONS: Applicants must have a minimum of an Associate degree in a related degree field such as early childhood education, elementary or secondary education, social work *and/or* equivalent experience of two years or more working with all ages in a structured setting. *Applicants must be fluent in the Mi'kmaq language.* Knowledge and/or experience working with Native American Culture is necessary. Emotional and mental maturity is mandatory along with training or skills in problem solving. A clean driver's license is necessary.

JOB SEGMENTS:

- ❖ Conduct all required grant assessments and oversee all aspects of the Native Connections project.
- ❖ Sharing Mi'kmaq Language resources with local community
- ❖ Work on and develop a Mi'kmaq language curriculum and then use the curriculum for regular language classes (community, Elders, Youth, and Head Start).
- ❖ Assist Cultural Coordinator in hosting Elder/Youth cultural activities (Basket making, regalia creation, cooking traditional meals, pottery, and drumming.)
- ❖ Leads by example and directions, expressing importance of: a) core values, respect, responsibility, caring and honesty, b) student safety, and c) enthusiastic fulfillment of program objectives.
- ❖ Integrate Mi'kmaq Culture and Tradition in Emergency SAMHSA ECOVID Project aspects.
- ❖ Perform other duties as assigned by the Tribal Historic Preservation Director.

- ❖ A positive role model at all times.
- ❖ Aid in providing a safe, healthy, and fun experience for members in the After-School Program.
